1. Purpose

This annex adopts the updated policy published in June 2024 by the Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia (RCPA) for **Reporting of Anatomical Pathology Specimens outside the Laboratory**

Accredited or Applicant facilities to ISO 15189 *Medical Laboratories - Requirements* for quality and competence and relevant NPAAC Requirements must ensure compliance with this annex from the effective date.

The RCPA policy includes details of off-site activities that must be reviewed when reporting occurs outside the laboratory.

2. Policy

NATA has adopted the requirements of the RCPA policy.

This annex shall apply from 1 October 2024 to all facilities reporting anatomical pathology accredited to ISO 15189 *Medical Laboratories - Requirements for quality and competence* and the relevant NPAAC requirements.
